It has been a busy late fall and winter in Homer Township!

Regarding the Fire Department, last fall the north side of the fire barn parking lot was reconstructed and looks great! Currently, the Township Board is working with the Fire Department to purchase a new fire truck.

Refinancing was completed for the bonds for some of the water districts, reducing the interest rates.

Spicer Group was recently hired to update our Master Plan. The Master Plan sets a course for land use policies for the future. They will be requesting input from the residents through email surveys and public hearings. Your input is valuable for future direction for the Township.

The Board is still looking for people to serve on the Park Committee. We would like to develop a plan to improve and enhance our Homer Township Park. Please contact me if interested.

The State imposed a 2.4% increase in taxable value for all land owners. We just completed the 2013 Board of Review where residents had the opportunity to appeal their assessments. Thanks to the Board of Review Committee for their hard work this week.

Summer tax bills will be in the mail soon. Please check your tax bill as soon as you receive it to be sure the Principal Residence Exemption is correct. If your Principal Residence Exemption is incorrect it can be corrected at the July Board of Review and a new tax bill can be issued. The July Board of Review meets Tues. following the second Mon. in July. If you need a form or have questions concerning the exemption, please call or email me.

Spring is here and there are still a few things to do before you can grab that fishing pole or golf clubs I hope you are properly planning your next project or new home. If you are going to be building a new home------Thank you for choosing Homer Township-We warmly welcome you to our community. If you need a worksheet, checklist and permit application to guide you through this simple process, please, please, contact me so you can proceed without getting into untimely delays. They are also available on our website. Click on fees and applications, print off both the requirements and application, fill them out and call me. New requirements for dwellings and additions have been installed this new code cycle (2009 edition and the latest version of the Energy Code) so please contact me or

your design professional for these updates and verifications.

As I have stated before, permits are very important for your building progress in Homer Twp. If your project is a deck or utility barn under 200 sq ft., you will not need a building permit- but please be sure to check on the zoning setbacks. Anything and everything else needs a Building permit..... Demolition of any kind to a structure, Pools, Ponds. and leantoo's..... It may fall under the No Charge category, but you still need to pursue one. OR- How do you know if you need a permit? Call me please, and I will return your call, fax and / or message as soon as I can. Electrical and plumbing/heating questions also?.....At least call the inspector to inquire. The call is cheap compared to the double fee and a citation charge of construction fraud filed against you for proceeding without a permit. Please, believe me when I say we (all the inspectors) are on your side so that the project will proceed smoothly without delays and problems. The office is still on the corner of E. Olson Rd and N. Homer Rd.

Thank you and we are looking forward to assisting you.

Website fun facts: Website visits peaked twice in the last quarter of 2012 with over 1100 hits each of the last two weeks in Oct. and the weeks from Dec. 2-15. The search engine most used was google.com (87%), most used operating system was Windows (89%), and the most used browsers were Mozilla (41%), Internet Explorer (28%). and Firefox (14%). #### PLANNING COMMISSION NOTES

In 2012 the Planning Commission held 12 regular monthly meetings and 1 public hearing. The major items addressed were: 1completed updating the zoning map to reflect past years board approved changes; 2recommended township participation in the expanded GIS mapping available to townships; 3-approved greater flexibility in the principle & accessory uses allowed in business districts; 4-began updating of the township master plan last done in 1997.

The updating of the master plan will continue throughout 2013 and possibly into early 2014 due to legislative guidelines that require long waiting periods throughout to allow for input. Through a competitive process we selected the Spicer Group to assist us in the updating process. There will be various means and opportunities for all township residents to have input into updating the plan. The plan is the focal point for identifying land uses for the coming 5+ years. In this process we must review census trends, what other surrounding townships are proposing, state/national trends, as well as township financial, cultural, educational,

recreational, business and residential opportunities to ensure long term growth. The plan will propose future land use designations based on all of these areas. While the major focus will be on our main highway corridors, all areas of the township will be reviewed. This is everyone's opportunity to have input in what the future of Homer Township could look like. The new plan will serve as the base for updating the zoning map and all decisions made by the planning commission. Watch the township website for updates and the Spicer website to view ongoing activity regarding the master plan!

If a tornado, flood, chemical accident or some other extraordinary event occurs, emergency responders will provide information to you about the event and its potential effect on the community through this emergency information hotline. Call this number for official information and instructions when you become aware of an emergency or disaster in Midland County. You may also tune to WMPX AM 1490 or WMRX FM 97.7 to receive emergency information.

#### Who Need a Burn Permit, Who Does Not??

#### Burn Permits are issued only for:

\*Limbs \*Brush \*Stumps \*Evergreen needles \*Leaves \*Grass


\*Ongoing burns for construction and land clearing, roadway maintenance, and uncertified party's performing prescribed burns without a written plan <u>require a burn</u> permit issued by the local DNR Fire Manager.

#### **Burn permits are NOT required:**

\*Cooking or recreational campfires

\*Anytime there is a continuous snow cover adjacent to your fire

\*Household paper materials that does not contain plastic, rubber, foam, or textiles that is burned in a container constructed of metal or masonry, with a covering device having openings no larger than <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of an inch



Burning permits may be obtained using the Michigan DNR webpage at *www.michigan.gov/burnpermit*, or toll free telephone line 866-922-2876 between the hours of 8:00 AM and 8:00 PM daily.
