Winter is finally gone and spring is in the air!

As I look at the last tax season I see a couple issues that may be helpful if I clarify them. First is the online bill payment of your tax bills. Be



sure to have your bank send out your check at least 5 business days prior to the due date. The account number you should use for your online bill payment check is the parcel number which always starts with "040". We need to also remember that postmarks are not accepted.

I collect taxes at the Township office through February 28th and on March 1st by 8am I am required to have my tax roll turned over to the Midland County Treasurer. Also, since this last tax season had a number of errors when residents have filled out their checks, it would be helpful if you could **include your phone number** on your check or on your tax bill. Many of you have disconnected your land lines and only use cell phones and it is very hard to find those numbers. If you have any questions on your taxes, be sure to give me a call at the Township office.

I have received a number of calls asking about the **recycle dates** for the township. We have now placed those dates on the Homer Township website for your convenience.

I encourage you to attend our Township meetings on the 3rd Wednesday of the month. Come and see how your local government works and be informed on the issues that come before the board.

Enjoy your summer and watch for your 2014 summer tax bill – to be mailed by July 1st.

We are looking forward to a great Spring and Summer in Homer Township. Do you have plans for a small building project or for building a new home in the next few months? Please take a few minutes to review the Township worksheet, checklist and permit application to guide you through this simple process and contact me so you can proceed without getting into untimely delays. The forms are also available online, click on *Fees and Applications*, print off both the *Requirements and the Application*, fill them out and then contact me.

If your project is a deck or utility barn under 200 sq ft., you will not need a building permitbut please be sure to check on the zoning setbacks. *Anything and everything else* needs a Building Permit, including demolition of any structure, pool, pond. or lean-to. It may fall under the *No Charge* category, but you still need to pursue one.

How do you know if you need a permit? Contact me please, I will return your call, fax or e-mail as soon as I can. For electrical, plumbing or heating questions, call the appropriate inspector to clarify your specific issues. The call is cheap compared to the double fee and a citation charge of construction fraud filed



against you for proceeding without a permit. Please, believe me when I say we (all the inspectors) are on your side so that the project will proceed smoothly without delays.

Our office is located in the Township Hall on the corner of E. Olson Road and N. Homer Road. Thank you, we look forward to assisting you!

New Fire Engine

Burn permits

Once the snow goes away, you need to call to find out if open burning is being allowed in Midland County. You can only burn brush, sticks, leaves and stumps. No household waste or any type of building materials. You MUST call before you burn! 1-866-922-2876.

Meridian Road Bridge repairs

The Meridian Road Bridge over the Pine River is being repaired, requiring a detour right through the heart of Homer Township. Large trucks are being routed down South Homer Rd. to Pine River Rd. to 4 ¾ Mile Road and then to Dopp Road. Please be aware of these large vehicles, and give them the room they need to operate.

The total focus of the Planning Commission since the October, 2013 newsletter has been the update of the **Township Master Plan**. We have completed several reviews and updates that address community needs for the coming 15 years as well as updating our future land use map to support the changes suggested. This is an extremely slow process and one that requires much discussion involving both the Board and Planning Commission. It involves looking not only at Homer Township, but surrounding townships as well as state and national trends. Our goal is to be relevant with changing demographics and trends such as: aging populations, housing trends and community services, while retaining the community characteristics that residents now value and wish to continue.

At our March and April planning meetings we will be reviewing the draft implementation plan that will enable us to achieve the future goals we have identified. Hopefully in the May-June time period we will schedule an open house at which time you will all be invited to come and review the proposed future plan for the Township and provide your input. Following that meeting we will again consider all of the input and make changes to the future plan that incorporate your input. The plan will then be sent to the city, county, and all surrounding townships for their review and comments following which our board will be able to adopt the new master plan. If all goes smoothly that new plan should be adopted in the early fall.

BioBlitz


Fri, Sept 19 • 6-10pm & Sat, Sept 20, 2014
