The Township Hall is available to all Homer Township residents -- there is a \$20 deposit when you reserve the day for your event and an additional \$40 due when you pick up the key. The deposit will be mailed back to you if everything is OK with the hall.

It is important that you call me to make reservations for use of the hall and for the pavilions in order to prevent any conflict on days of use. There is no rental fee for the use of either pavilion but you still need to check on the availability.

The hall is already totally reserved for the month of June.

We just finished another tax season and I have a few pointers for you. This year I had about two dozen residents write checks for their tax bills where the written amount and the numerical amount of the check did not match. It is an easy mistake to make. It would be very helpful to me if everyone wrote their phone number on their tax bill or their check. In case of an error or a question, I would then have a contact phone number. With everyone going to cell phones these days, it is extremely hard to locate a phone number.

As a reminder, **postmarks are not accepted** at the end of the winter tax season. I have to have the delinquent tax roll sent to the Midland County treasurer the morning after taxes are due. By law, I cannot accept taxes after the Feb. 28th due date. Please allow at least 5 days for mail delivery.

Many times when we move, contacting the township treasurer to change your address is the last thing we think about and it results in many tax bills being returned for incorrect addresses. Please contact the treasurer to request a change of address form to be sent to you. This will help with return mail, trying to find accurate addresses and getting your tax bills to you in a timely manner.

Do you want to help decide the future for our Homer Township Parks? The Township Board has been working to make changes to our parks and we now have bids from three companies to help us to: 1) develop goals for the parks, 2) prioritize and create a schedule for the changes to take place, 3) create a master plan for the parks, 4) identify grant sources and help write the first grant request.

How can Homer Township residents help? Board members have identified several people whom we will ask to help create the Parks Committee, however, we want more residents to participate If vou have any interest in being on the committee. please contact me or Russ Varner, supervisor@homertownship.org asap and tell us about yourself and your interest in being on the committee. We would like you to help us chose the winning bid and to complete a grant request to complete for lighting at the park ice rink.

Once a winning bid is selected, there will be a survey created for residents to give us their input on what they would like to see included in our parks. So the second way to contribute is to think about what you want in the parks and discuss it with other residents. The number of residents who indicate each item helps determine the priority for each item. So let us know how many people would like a walking path, horseshoe pits, basketball courts, volleyball courts, better parking, shade trees, new playground equipment, newer lighting, field marking equipment for soccer and football fields, etc. Let us know what you want to see in your parks in the future!

You cannot burn household waste or any type of building materials. **You MUST call before you burn. The contact number is 1-866-922-2876**.

The Planning Commission is working on the **revision of the township zoning ordinance** so it coincides with the revised master land use plan. This requires a very detailed review and revision of residential and commercial districts as the master plan has consolidated some of the current designations. We will be reviewing and updating every unit of the zoning ordinance to ensure that it complies with recent state legislative changes to current laws and newly added laws.

In addition we will also be addressing current issues such as 'urban farming', domestic animals, The Right to Farm Act, and a number of other important issues.
